

## WANDERER MADEIRA

In the 18th and 19th centuries, Madeira was the United States' most prestigious wine, shipped to connoisseurs in major seaports from New Orleans to Boston. Frequently, these early Madeiras were named for ships like the Wanderer that carried them. During the early and mid-1800s, this vessel travelled the globe, and on a number of occasions she brought Madeira to America. During the 1840s and 1850s, a number of Madeiras named "Wanderer" could be found in wealthy New York homes. At least one of these wines had been to India first on the Wanderer—a journey that enhanced its quality.

The wine in this bottle is made entirely of Tinta Negra Mole grown on Madeira's south coast in the 1940s or 1950s; at the time of bottling in 2006, it was believed to be about 60 years old. Just 60 bottles were produced.
