

THE LEE FAMILY STRATFORD HALL SPECIAL RESERVE

Virginia produced four of our first five Presidents, but no greater dynasty than the Lees. Richard Henry Lee was, of all the founding fathers, among the earliest and most outspoken defenders of American liberty and democracy. "Light Horse Harry" Lee was famed for his Revolutionary War exploits before becoming Governor of Virginia. And Robert E. Lee achieved immortality as General of the Army of Northern Virginia.

At the family's Stratford Hall Plantation, overlooking the Potomac, several generations of Lee men prided themselves on their taste in Madeira. Like other Southern aristocrats, they considered Madeira their ancestral beverage and a mark of wealth and discernment. They particularly prized Madeira of relatively light color, delicacy and moderate sweetness, similar to the wine in this bottle.

This Madeira was made for us on the Island of Madeira by Vinhos Barbeito, from wines patiently aged by the time-honored *Canteiro* method.
